

**MINUTES

JUNE 5, 2006**

The regularly scheduled meeting of the North Lebanon Township Board of Supervisors was held at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building located at 725 Kimmerlings Road, Lebanon, PA with the following people present:

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

There were no comments from the Public this evening.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION was made and seconded to approve the minutes from May 15, 2006. Unanimously carried.

APPROVAL PAYROLL, PAYMENT OF INVOICES, FUND BALANCES

MOTION was made and seconded to approve payroll, invoices for payment subject to audit. Unanimously carried.

TOWNSHIP MANAGERS REPORT – Cheri F. Grumbine

A.)Request from Avon Zion United Methodist Church

A request from the Avon Zion United Methodist Church has been received. They are requesting permission to close off Mishler Street, which is located beside the parking lot for the church in order to hold a community outreach event. The event would be held Saturday, July 8th from 7AM to 7PM. A map has been provided showing the area they are planning to use for this event. Chf Easter has been provided with a copy of the information in order to receive any of his concerns or comments. He has reported there does not seem to be any reason for this request not to be approved. His department agreed to keep an eye on the parking in this area on the day of this event in case there should be any problems that should arise.

Chp Hawkins questioned if there would be any residents affected by the closing off of Mishler Street on the day of the event? Suv Brensinger replied that the street basically is the parking lot for the church. Suv Hawkins asked if there are plans to use barricades to close off the street on that day? Mgr Grumbine replied there were not any requests for equipment so she is thinking they would be closing the street using their own means.

MOTION was made and seconded to approve the request from the Avon Zion United Methodist Church to close Mishler Street on July 8th. Unanimously carried.

B.)Resolution No. 9-2006; Energizing Streetlights for Orchard View Development

In order to cover any electric costs, the policy of the Twp is to wait until 90% of any development is constructed before energizing the streetlights. The Township streetlight taxes are compiled in February, for those areas that have streetlights, and are mailed at the same time as the real estate taxes on March 1 of each year. If the lights are not approved for energizing by February and included in the March mailing the Twp are not able to recover the cost of electric until the following tax year. The cost of electric per light is \$10 per month.

Resolution No. 9-2006 (con't)

Residents from the Orchard View Development have made numerous requests to have the streetlights activated. In order to energize the lights at this time of the year, we require the developer to be responsible for the costs involved. The developer for this development has agreed to accept the responsibility for the costs and we have received his check as of last week. Therefore Resolution No. 9-2006 is being presented for activation of the streetlights in Orchard View and in 2007 these lights will be added to our Street Light tax for the area residents.

MOTION was made and seconded to adopt Resolution 9-2006 for the energizing of the streetlights in Orchard View Development. Unanimously carried.

C.) Invite To GLRA July 5th Meeting

An invitation has been received from the GLRA to attend their regular meeting scheduled for July 5th at 7 PM. The purpose of this meeting is to honor municipalities that have demonstrated recycling efforts in the last year, 2005. The top 5 municipalities will receive an award that evening. A response for the number of people attending is requested and will need to be made to the GLRA. Suv Artz told Mgr Grumbine he would definitely like to attend. Suv Brensinger and Hawkins stated they would let her know after they have checked their schedules.

D.) Paving Bids for Handicapped Access Path

On Friday, June 2 the bids for the walking trail or handicapped access path from North 8th Avenue parking lot to the athletic fields were opened. The bid results were as follows: Landis Deck Inc. \$22,301.46, Pennsy Supply \$24,075.00 and B.R. Kreider \$24,428.00. The apparent low bidder was Landis Deck Inc.. Sol Wolf has had the opportunity to review the bids and has commented the related insurance information and performance bonds will need to be provided to the Township. He is recommending that the Board approve the apparent low bid from Landis Deck Inc. When asked if the Twp has ever had work completed by this company before, it was reported not by this particular company. However this is a division of the H & K Company, Haines and Kibblehouse who has performed work within the Twp and for the Twp.

MOTION was made and seconded to approve the bid of \$22,301.46 received from Landis Deck Inc. for the handicapped walking path located on the N 8th Avenue athletic fields contingent upon the appropriate insurance and bonding being submitted. Unanimously carried.

E.) Supervisors Meeting of June 19, 2006

Mgr Grumbine reported she has been informed there would be 2 of the 3 Supervisors not able to attend the second meeting this month. Therefore a quorum will not be had. She is recommending announcement that the meeting would be cancelled. Chp Hawkins announced this evening that the June 19th meeting is cancelled and is was discussed placing a notice on the door and a notice would be placed on the Twp website to serve as notice to the Public. As all the regular attendees are present, the notices discussed should be adequate notice about the cancellation. The next meeting would be held on Monday July 3rd. The Twp office will closed on Tuesday July 4th in observance of the Holiday.

COMMENTS FROM BOARD MEMBERS**A.) Suv Ed Brensinger**

Suv Brensinger wanted to make the residents aware that the Road crew is now beginning its seasonal road construction schedule. Work has begun on East Kercher Avenue at this time between Prescott Dr and Halfway Dr. and W Kercher Ave between Grace Ave and Kenbrook Rd would be the other areas that will be worked on this season. PADOT has started work on N 7th St from the City line to the most northern line of NL Twp. These areas will necessitate stop and go traffic. The motorists are urged to use caution when traveling through these areas.

Suv Ed Brensinger (con't)

Some discussion followed about the traffic lights that are proposed throughout Lebanon County and the lengthy amount of time these requests involve. The question of the requested traffic light for N 7th Street and Kimmerlings Rd/ Kochenderfer Rd was brought up once again.

B.) Suv Ken Artz

Suv Artz mentioned the increase in the Police coverage throughout the county to combat the speeding motorists. Not just NL Twp but all municipalities. A countywide effort is being expended to catch any speeding motorists.

As there was no more business to conduct or discuss the meeting adjourned.
