

**MINUTES
NORTH LEBANON TOWNSHIP
PARKS & RECREATION BOARD
June 7, 2011**

The meeting of the North Lebanon Township Parks & Recreation Board was called to order at 7:00 PM at the North Lebanon Township Municipal Building located at 725 Kimmerlings Road, North Lebanon Township. The meeting started with the pledge to the flag.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

There were no comments from the public due to the fact there was no public in attendance.

NEW BUSINESS

Pertinent Issues

Sheila stated she had received a check from Keystone Fireworks for \$300 to set up their fireworks tent over the Fourth of July holiday. This was the same payment as last year.

Sheila explained she had also received a check from Landmark for Phase 1 of the Crossings at Sweet Briar which goes into fees in lieu of account. This payment in the amount of \$46,375 is for the 53 lots in Phase 1.

OLD BUSINESS

DCNR Grant progress

Sheila said she had received an email from Beth from DCNR asking for all of the required information including the architect drawing for the pavilion/bathroom, which we have not yet received. Sheila said she did receive a set of construction plans from Rettew, all the permitting is in place, and she and Cheri went into County and Cheri signed the land development plan. She reported that things are moving in the right direction.

Sheila said she had taken some photos of the Meiley memorial. She explained she was unable to attend the dedication. She mentioned Supervisor Brensinger did attend and was able to say a few words and they were able to complete the ballgame. It was reported there were approximately 400 people in attendance.

Sheila also reported she had seen the new sign at the Lenni Lenape Park and it is very nice.

Pertinent Issues

Lions Lake Dam

Regarding the lake inspection, Sheila reported that Jeff Steckbeck came to the office and they had a conference call with DEP to see if they would acknowledge the work that had already been completed. She stated the game plan is to have Jeff Steckbeck come to the July 18th Board of Supervisors meeting to update the Board. She explained DEP wants to see what the pipe looks like and their suggestion is to drain the lake and inspect the pipe or remove all the silt around it and then inspect the interior of the pipe. She further explained either option will be costly. She said she is not sure how we will proceed. Question was asked if there was a way they could fix the pipe that it would be easier to inspect in the future. Discussion followed regarding possibilities to solve the problem to which Sheila replied DEP issues the permits and that if they refuse to issue the permit they could mandate the lake be drained and then there will not be an issue with the dam.

With there being no more business brought before the Parks and Recreation Board the meeting was adjourned at 7:25 P.M.
