

**MINUTES

NEW BUSINESS

Park Inspection Results

The parks were visited by members of the safety committee on June 17th. The biggest problem that the members noted was the excessive amount of trash at Lion's Lake and the Long Lane fields. One of the dugout walls at the John Lyter field seemed to be loose and should be fixed. There were 2 areas at the Lion's Lake pavilion where there was evidence of bee/wasp nests that should be addressed. For the most part, the parks looked good and it was noted that it is a lot of work to keep them maintained with a very limited staff.

Fees in Lieu of Update

We received \$46,375.00 from Phase 1 of the Crossings at Sweet Briar and that has been placed in the fund to use for Lenni Lenape improvements.

Pertinent Issues

There were no pertinent issues.

OLD BUSINESS

DCNR Grant progress

We continue to work with DCNR and planners to move toward starting this project. It is a slow go as there are many different aspects that must be resolved before DCNR will give us permission to begin.

Trail Extension

The trail at Lenni Lenape Park was visited during the safety inspection. We now have 2 distinct portions completed, one being a flatter terrain and one a bit more challenging to walk. These were both completed by Eagle Scout candidates as well as a sign that has been installed along Weavertown Road to show the trail area. Some have asked where they can park to walk the trails. They can turn in at the sign and continue straight as far as their vehicle will allow due to weather conditions. At this time there are no formal markings for the trail.

Lake Issue

Jeff Steckbeck will be attending the Board of Supervisors meeting on July 18th to update the Board as to the options for the Lion's Lake inspection required by DCNR.

Pertinent Issues

There were no pertinent issues.

With there being no more business brought before the Parks and Recreation Board the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 P.M.
