

**MINUTES
NORTH LEBANON TOWNSHIP
PARKS & RECREATION BOARD
February 6, 2007**

The meeting of the North Lebanon Township Parks & Recreation Board was called to order at 7:00 PM at the North Lebanon Township Municipal Building located at 725 Kimmerlings Road, North Lebanon Township. The meeting started with the pledge to the flag.

MOTION: Motion was made and seconded to approve the January minutes. Motion unanimously approved.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

There were no comments from the public.

NEW BUSINESS

Comprehensive Plan Update

Sheila reported that the master plans have been distributed to DCNR and to the County for comments and revisions. She stated they have had some positive response to the plan from residents. Chairperson Smith stated he believed that overall the plan had been accepted fairly well at the Board of Supervisors meeting with the understanding that this would take place over a period of time. One resident had expressed disapproval of some of the points of the plan. Sheila further stated for the Board's information the original survey, included in the Comp Plan, was sent to a random sample. However, it was advertised on the website and in the newsletter that surveys would be available at the Township office. She stated the next step would be to get approval from the County to make sure it was in line with their comprehensive plan and DCNR.

Eagle Scout Project Update

Sheila stated that Clayton Snyder had identified the trees, catalogued the list of dedications, and cleaned the plaques at Lions Lake. He is going to make a large map which will show all the locations of the tree dedications. Sheila said she brought one of three of the albums which he completed so the Board could see the excellent work he has done.

Pertinent Issues

Letter requesting permission to open a produce stand near Lions Lake

Sheila stated she had received a letter from a couple who would like to set up a fruit stand from July through October in the area of the dam breast facing Route 72. Discussion followed regarding feasibility and to get a better understanding of what might be involved. Fees were discussed in order to give them an idea what they might expect to pay. The Board agreed they would like them to attend the next meeting.

Letter from Union Canal Athletic Association

Sheila stated she received a letter requesting to use the three baseball fields on the Township property. She said opening day would be around March 26th with games and practices until mid July. She said they normally have a clean up and maintenance day before the season opens. She stated they have asked about Diamond Tex. She stated Dave believed they could make do with what they have and what is in the budget. There are seven fields to distribute the two loads they received and the remainder of what they already have.

OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business discussed.

With there being no more business brought before the Park and Recreation Board the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 P.M.
